These are full time, paid positions. The first opportunity for formal schooling and a pay increase is within the first 6 months (or sooner). Everyone is expected to be able to help with the basic Automotive PMS in the Service Department while preparing for school (similar to a Lube tech responsibility). Starting pay is entirely based upon the local rate for a beginning mechanic (not-certified). Credit can be given for experience.

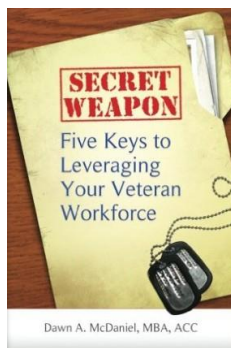
